

7. Gift Aid

If you are a UK tax payer, using Gift Aid means that for every £1 you give, we can claim an extre 25 pence from HM Revenue and Customs. Sign and date to make your membership go further and support the CRM Society.

- 1. You can cancel your Gift Aid declaration at any time by notifying the Society.
- 2. You must pay an amount of income tax and / or capital gains tax at least equal to the tax that the Society reclaims on your donations in the tax year.

(currently 25p for every £1 you give)

- 3. If in the future your circumstances change and you no longer pay tax on your income and capital gains equal to the tax that the Society reclaims, you can cancel your declaration. (see note 1)
