

Volunteers are encouraged to take advantage of the numerous self service resources at the Society to enhance their learning.

#### Will I be paid or reimbursed for expenses?

Volunteers at the CRM Society are not paid or reimbursed for their expenses. Certain expenses will be reimbursed if they are a result of a request by the Society.

## How much time would I have to give?

Each volunteer can chose how much time they can commit. Society hours are Monday to Friday 10:00am - 5:00pm. The CRM Society will have events in the evenings and weekends that will provide volunteer opportunities outside the general hours of business.
